#### **OPENING MAURITSHUIS**

This month, the Mauritshuis will reopen to the public. The paintings returned from their world tour and are being installed in the redecorated galleries.

Our members should have received an invitation to the *Special Preview* on Thursday, June 26th. The *Grand Opening* will take place the following day on Friday, June 27th and includes our Director's Circle members. If you wish to attend either opening, need to renew or upgrade your membership, <u>please contact us</u>. Members receive free admission to the Mauritshuis.

At the Friends Party at The Frick in New York October, we announced our contribution of \$100,000 towards the lighting of the paintings. Also, in 2012, the American Friends supported the funding of a new frame for Paulus Potter's *The Bull*. The Potter, one of the highlights of the collection, was in need of a new frame before being exhibited in it's temporary home the Gemeentemuseum during the renovation. We hope we can do more this year with your help!

#### **FELLOWSHIP**

Megan Salazar-Walsh, recipient of the 2013-2014 American Friends of the Mauritshuis Fellowship, just returned from her six-month internship in The Hague and is now at the Walters Art Museum in Baltimore. Megan focused on the research and treatment of paintings commissioned from the traveling Venetian artist, Giovanni Antonio Pellegrini



(1675-1741) around 1718 for the Golden Room: three ceiling paintings, two chimney paintings, four grisailles and six tondos. Previously, the attribution to Pellegrini and date of the tondos had been questioned. However, examination revealed that the preparatory ground layer on the tondos is identical to the ground used for the ceiling and chimney paintings. In order to understand the original appearance, carefully selected

paint samples were taken and examined with a microscope. Cross-sections revealed that metal leaf was applied over a mordant layer directly on the ground layer; with the flowers painted on top of the metal leaf. Subsequent elemental analysis carried out at Shell Technology Centre in Amsterdam revealed that the metal leaf is composed of copper and zinc.
